Today in Sunday School, we talked about the gift of salvation as discussed in Paul's letter to the Ephesians. There is a big difference between a gift and a prize. A prize is something that you earn; you work hard to achieve a goal. A gift is freely given out of love. You do not earn presents, you get presents because someone cares. Salvation is a gift from God; we cannot earn our way into Heaven. We aren't good enough. God gives that gift to all of us freely, and purely out of love.

That being said, Paul also reminds us that to show others the gift of salvation, we need to be workers for God. Good works are a part of our faith. They don't get us into Heaven, but they do help to accomplish God's work on Earth and fight against the works of Satan. Good works are something Christians do to spread the news of God's gift to all people.

This week's Lenten focus is simplification. We get so caught up in our works that we often forget to remember the gift!
